
SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 24





And as an aside - St.Paul's Anglican Church in Chapelton, where they worshipped, just celebrated its 350th anniversary.

FOOD PANTRY

Your Food Pantry continues to provide for the less fortunate among us. Special thanks go to the members of our congregation who continue to donate cash or items to the Pantry, as well as the congregation of St.

Luke the Physician who continue their monthly food drive for St. Faith's. For the months of May, June & July a total of 566 bags were distributed. These went to approximately 177 households each month, impacting 550 people who live in those households. Eight homeless kits were distributed. The Food Pantry now opens one day per week (on Thursdays from 9:15 – 1:30) instead of two. This has proven to be more efficient for all concerned.
